About this course

Make a meaningful difference in the lives of others as a disability support worker. Provide individual support to help your clients reach their full potential, engage with their community and pursue their personal goals.

- Help clients with domestic duties and personal care needs
- Help clients with their social and emotional health
- Aid clients to move safely from one area to another
- Assist clients navigate the NDIS system and gain access to other services
- Empower clients to feel independent and reach their goals
- Build relationships with carers and families

Graduates of this course will be highly sought-after in the personal care industry. The number of personal care workers employed is expected to grow very strongly and likely to reach 341, 800 by 2026 (source: Australian Government's Job Outlook service).

Assessment

- A Working with Children Check (WWCC)
